Miscellaneous Curriculum Changes (effective fall 2012)

Department of American Studies

To add the following courses to the regular concentration of the BA major in American studies:

- Literature: AMST 365, 370
- Ideas and Traditions: AFAM 269; AMST 337
- Expressive Arts and Popular Culture: AFAM 356; AMST 340; HIST 671
- Ethnicity and Diversity: AMST 339, 392; ENGL 371; FOLK 610; HIST 358; RELI 248

To add the following courses to the southern studies concentration of the BA major in American studies:

- History and Social Sciences: AMST 350; HIST 671
- Art and Expressive Culture: ENGL 371; FOLK/HIST 571

To add the following courses to the American Indian studies concentration of the BA major in American studies:

- History: HIST/WMST 576
- Social Science (renamed from “Culture”): ANTH 206, 250
- Expressive Culture (renamed from “Literature”): AMST 340

To delete the following courses from the American Indian studies concentration of the BA major in American studies:

- Social Science (renamed from “Culture”): HIST/WMST 576
- Expressive Culture (renamed from “Literature”): AMST 440

To reduce the number of courses required for the American Indian studies concentration of the BA major in American studies from 10 to nine by permitting one, instead of two, additional courses to be drawn from the concentration’s course lists or, with the approval of the director of undergraduate studies, to substitute an additional course not on the concentration’s course lists.

To revised the minor in American Indian studies as follows:

“The minor in American Indian studies consists of five courses: AMST/HIST 110 and four additional courses chosen from the following categories. Minors are strongly encouraged, though not required, to take AMST 203 Approaches to American Indian Studies.

- Introduction: AMST/HIST 110
- History (at least one of the following): AFAM 294; AMST 203, 337, 339; AMST/HIST 231, 233, 235; AMST/HIST/ANTH 234; HIST 232; HIST/WMST 576
- Social Science (at least one of the following): AMST/HIST/ANTH 234; ANTH 206, 250, 451; ANTH/FOLK 230

- Expressive Culture (at least one of the following): AMST 246, 336, 338, 340; ART 259
- One other course drawn from the above lists or approved by the director of undergraduate studies”

Department of Anthropology

To add ANTH 278, 280, 320, 422, 437, and 439 to the course list for the minor in medical anthropology; to add ANTH 445, 446, 474, 623, 624, and 650 to the same list; and to delete ANTH 438 and 660 from the same list.

Curriculum in Archaeology

To reduce the number of required courses in the comparative perspective category of the major in archaeology from two to one, and to increase the number of required courses in the long-term history category from one to two.

To restrict the rule in the major in archaeology that no more than three courses be numbered under 200 to courses fulfilling major requirements; it does not apply to the two courses used as electives from other fields.

To add ANTH 123 and 222 to the list of comparative perspectives courses in the major in archaeology and remove ANTH 143 from the same list.

To remove ANTH 123 from the list of general interest electives for the major in archaeology and add ANTH 143 to the same list.

To add ANTH 423, 454, and 650 to the list of topics in archaeology courses for the major and minor in archaeology, and to add ARCH 393, 395, and 396 to the same list of topical courses for the minor in archaeology.

To permit students to count as an elective archaeology course for the major in archaeology one of the following courses: ARCH 393, 395, 396, 691H, and 692H.

To add ANTH 123 and 222 to the comparative perspective courses for the minor in archaeology.

Department of Asian Studies

To add Korea as a sixth region from which students can choose courses for Asian studies major concentrations and minors, and include KOR 150, 151, and 327 in this category.

Add the following courses to the list of courses fulfilling the South Asia regional requirement for major concentrations and minors: ASIA 122, 224, 332; ASIA/GEOG 267.

Add the following courses to the list of courses fulfilling the China regional requirement for major concentrations and minors: HIST 284; CHIN 342, 456.

Add the following courses to the list of courses fulfilling the Japan regional requirement for major concentrations and minors: ASIA 63; JAPN 231, 246, 363.

Add the following courses to the list of courses fulfilling the Middle East regional requirement for major concentrations and minors: ARAB 443, 477; ASIA 62, 122, 222, 224, 225; ASIA/RELI 180, 181.

Add the following course to the list of courses fulfilling the Southeast Asia regional requirement for major concentrations and minors: ASIA 466.

Remove the following courses from the “Other Courses” list fulfilling the requirements for the major: AMST 253; ENGL 289; GERM 56, 270; HIST 262; JAPN 378.

To add ARAB 300, 443, and 477 to the course list for the Arabic minor.

To replace ARAB 123 and 223 with ARAB 300 in the major with a concentration in Arab cultures, and add ARAB 443 and 477 to the course list.

To remove CHIN 307 and 462, courses that can no longer be offered, as a requirement for Tracks A and B of the major concentration in Chinese, returning the major to eight courses; to ratify Associate Dean Lindemann’s 8/22/2011 approval of the department’s request to excuse students entering Carolina in 2010 and 2011 from taking CHIN 307 for Track A of this major.

To add the language courses CHIN 440, 441, 442 (Track A only), 511, 532 and the culture courses CHIN 342 and 456 to the major concentration in Chinese, and to eliminate for both tracks the option to replace the two required culture courses with additional language courses.

To add to the major concentration in South Asia ASIA 122, 332; and ASIA/GEOG 267.

To add to the major concentration in Japanese ASIA 63, JAPN 231, 246, 363, and 420 and delete JAPN 378, 517, 518, and 519.

To add ASIA 332 to the Hindi-Urdu minor.

To add KOR 327 to the Korean minor.

To add CHIN 440, 441, 442, 511, 532, 342, 456 to the Chinese minor and remove CHIN 307 and 462.

To delete the following courses from the Hebrew minor: AMST 253; ASIA 435; ASIA/HIST 276, 538; ENGL 289; GERM 56, 270; HIST 262; RELI 106, 107, 110, 205, 206, 503, 512, 602.

To add JAPN 420 to the Japanese minor and remove JAPN 517, 518, and 519.

Department of Biology

To add BIOL 528 to the BS major in biology (quantitative biology track) as an alternative to BIOL 527/527L in the list of quantitative biology laboratory courses.

To add BIOL 528 to the list of quantitative biology electives for the BS major in biology (quantitative biology track).

Department of Classics

To reduce, for the BA major in classics (classical civilization), the number of CLAS “Ages of X” courses from four of five to three of five, including their counterparts offered in the Department of History and taught by adjunct faculty in the Department of Classics: CLAS 253 (or HIST 424), CLAS 254 (or HIST 421), CLAS 257 (or HIST 425), CLAS 258 (or HIST 427), CLAS 259 (or HIST 428).

To add to the core requirements for the BA major in classics (classical civilization) a course in classical archaeology: CLAR 244, 245, or 247.

To require all BA majors in classics (classical civilization) who place out of LATN or GREK 204 to take a course at a higher level.

To permit any course at the 200-level or above dealing with Greek and/or Roman language, literature, history or culture to fulfill the requirements toward the BA major in classics (classical civilization).

Department of Computer Science

To add COMP 455 as a core requirement for the BS major in computer science

To replace the six-course computer science distribution requirement for the BS major in computer science with “Five additional three or more credit COMP courses numbered 426 or higher. Any one offering of COMP 590 may be counted toward this requirement without prior approval. Additional offerings of COMP 590 may be counted toward this requirement with the approval of the director of undergraduate studies.”

To revise the additional requirements for the BS major in computer science to read as follows:

- COMP 401, 410, and 411
- MATH 231, 232, 233, and 381
- PHYS 116 and a second science course from the following list:
 - BIOL 101/101L, 202, or 205
 - CHEM 101/101L or 102/102L

- GEOL 101/101L
- ASTR 101/101L
- PHYS 117
- A grade of C or better is required in each of COMP 401, COMP 410, COMP 411, MATH 231, MATH 232, MATH 233, MATH 381, PHYS 116, and the second science course.
- Students must earn a grade point average of 2.0 or higher and receive no grade lower than a C- in the nine core requirements listed above. (*Not approved by the Administrative Boards.*)

Curriculum in Contemporary European Studies

To clarify the major requirements that the remaining four courses from the themes requirement “must be distributed over at least two themes.”

To clarify the major requirement that “A minimum of four courses must be at the 400 level or above. ECON/EURO/PWAD 460 or POLI/EURO 442 may only count as one of these four courses if not counted toward the quantitative analysis requirement.”

To clarify the major requirement that “A minimum of four theme courses must be completed within a single social science department (i.e., ANTH, ECON, GEOG, HIST, POLI, SOCI). ECON/EURO/PWAD 460 or POLI/EURO 442 may count as one of these four courses.”

To add HUNG 280 and JWST/PLSH 412 to the course list for Theme III: Contemporary Europe: Images, Narratives, and Ideas, and to delete GERM 272 from the same course list.

Department of English and Comparative Literature

To add ENGL 357 and delete ENGL 279, 280, and 378 in the list of post-1900 courses required for the BA major in English

To add COMM 639 to the list of courses satisfying the requirements for the minor in creative writing and to stipulate that “At least three of the five courses taken for the minor—courses designated ENGL—must be Creative Writing Program courses taken at Carolina.”

Department of Exercise and Sport Science

To remove EXSS 141 as a requirement in the athletic training concentration of the BA major, increase the hours for EXSS 370 to three hours, and award credit for EXSS 271 five times.

To add RECR 430 as a possible elective for the sport administration concentration of the BA major.

Curriculum in Global Studies

To update the thematic and world areas course lists for the BA major in global studies as follows:

- International politics, nation-states, social movements – Add ANTH 360; MUSC 390H; POLI 235, 470, 471

- Global economics, trade, development – Add AFRI 540, ECON 434, 468; ENST 490; GEOG 464
- Global health and environment – Add AMST 499; ANTH 238, 473; GEOG 237, 269; PLCY 565
- Transnational cultures, identities, arts – Add AFRI/PWAD 520; ANTH 477; ASIA 455; ASIA/RELI 183; IDST 256; PWAD/SLAV 467
- Africa – Add AFRI 456, 521; AFRI/PWAD 520; WMST 289, 290
- Asia – Add ASIA 162, 253, 331, 333; ASIA/HIST 286; ASIA/RELI 183, 285; CHIN 354, 562; GEOG 399; GLBL 290; JAPN 375; KOR 150, 151
- Latin America – Add GEOG 430, HIST 242, 528; POLI 450; WMST 352
- Middle East – Add ARAB 151
- Western Europe and the European Union – Add ANTH 377; CMPL/EURO/FREN 332H; SPAN 340. Remove SPAN 349.
- Russia and Eastern Europe – Add JWST/PLSH 412; POLI/PWAD/RUES/SOCI 260; RUSS 469

Department of Philosophy

To publish in the *Undergraduate Bulletin* the following three course lists from which students minoring in philosophy, politics, and economics (PPE) must choose one course per category:

Philosophy courses: PHIL 160, 163, 164, 165, 170, 272, 273, 280, 364, 370

Political science courses: POLI 130, 216, 271, 288, 401, 441, 470, 470H, 472

Economics courses: ECON 101, 234, 267, 434, 454, 460, 510, 511

Department of Public Policy

To permit any 100- or 200-level PLCY course to count for three of the six credit hours of required electives for the BA major in public policy

To add the following courses to the list of courses satisfying the electives requirement and serving as optional field courses: BUSI 512; HNRS 352, 357; PLCY 110, 527

Department of Romance Languages

To add FREN 387 and FREN 595 to List A of the core requirements for the BA major in Romance languages with an emphasis in French and Francophone studies.

To add FREN 312 to List B of the core requirements for the BA major in Romance languages with an emphasis in French and Francophone studies.
