Re: Request for changes to the minor in Chinese

The following course is being added to the minor:

- CHIN 631: Writing Chinese (in) America: Advanced Studies of a Foreign Literature from U.S. Homeland [being proposed concurrently]

The minor description is also being changed to reflect the concurrent proposal to crosslist ASIA 56 with WMST 56.

Finally, language has been added to the minor description to more explicitly clarify the policy on PL credit.

Below is a revised version of the minor text for the Undergraduate Bulletin.

Chinese Minor

The undergraduate minor in Chinese consists of five courses. At least three of the courses must be language courses beyond CHIN 203 (the first semester of Intermediate Chinese), chosen from among the following: CHIN 204, 212, 305, 306, 313, 407, 408, 414, 440, 441, 442, 443, 490, 510, 511, 525, 532, ~~or 590~~, or 631. The other two courses may be chosen either from the same list or from among the following: ASIA 52, 55, ~~56~~, 65, 453; ASIA/WMST 56; CHIN 150, 231, 232, 242, 244, 252, 253, 255, 342, 346, 354, 356, 361, 367, 463, 464, 531, 551, 552, 562, 563. No more than one first-year seminar may be counted toward the minor. Placement credit (PL) may not be used to meet minor requirements.

As of 11/16/2015, cross-list request for WMST 56 has not been approved by the department.
