Please find attached the Curriculum In Global Studies changes to the *Undergraduate Bulletin*. The changes proposed update the courses that satisfy major requirements for the BA in Global Studies.

The Curriculum wishes the following existing courses be added to those that receive credit toward the major in global studies:

- PLCY 110 (core course)
- CMPL 143 (thematic concentration: Transnational cultures, identities, arts)
- GLBL 383 (thematic concentration: Transnational cultures, identities, arts)
- HIST 161 (area concentration: Russia/East Europe)
- POLI 236 (area concentration: Russia/East Europe)
- AAAD 412 (area concentration: Africa)

We have 8 new courses submitted for approval in CRAS: GLBL 88 Beg, Borrow, and Steal, GLBL 88H Beg, Borrow, and Steal, GLBL 401 Paradigms of Development and Social Change, GLBL 481H NGO Politics, GLBL 482H Soviet and Post-Soviet History and Politics, GLBL 483H Comparative Health Systems, GLBL 486H Sports and Globalization, & GLBL 491H Major Controversies in Human Rights. We have also updated the title of GLBL 210 (from Global Issues in the 20<sup>th</sup> Century to Global Issues and Globalization) in CRAS to better denote the current setting and orientation of the course.

Lastly, we have removed courses no longer offered at the University and all special topics courses from this iteration of our *Undergraduate Bulletin*, as students must get these courses approved on a case-by-case basis and Tar Heel Tracker occasionally populates these courses into our major fields erroneously.
