These courses take an anthropological approach and will add important issues to our curriculum.

Medical Anthropology Minor

This option is especially appropriate for those planning careers in medicine and health professions. The minor consists of five three-hour courses taken from the following list of courses: AAAD 300, <u>387</u>; ANTH 66H, 143, 147, 151, <u>217</u>, 270, 278, 280, 315, 318, 319, 320, 323, 325, <u>326</u>, <u>390</u>, 414, 422, 423, 426, 437, 439, 441, 442, 443, 444, 445, 446, 470, <u>471</u>, 473, 474, 538, 585, 623, 624, 649, and 650. Students must have a grade of C or better in at least four of the five courses, and at least three courses must be taken at UNC–Chapel Hill or in a program officially sponsored by the University. Students planning on a minor in medical anthropology should inform the department's director of undergraduate studies.
