The following courses, both being proposed concurrently, are being added to the minor:

- ASIA 53: First-Year Seminar: Israeli Popular Culture: The Case of Music
- ASIA/JWST/PWAD 425: Beyond Hostilities: Israeli-Palestinian Exchanges and Collaborations in Cinema, Literature, & Music

The minor description is also being changed to reflect the concurrent crosslisting proposals.

Finally, language has been added to the minor description to more explicitly clarify the policy on PL credit.

Below is a revised version of the minor text for the Undergraduate Bulletin.

Modern Hebrew Minor

The undergraduate minor in Hebrew consists of four courses. Three courses are language courses beyond HEBR 203 (the first semester of Intermediate Hebrew). The other course must be chosen from among the following: ASIA 5360, 235, 357; ASIA/HIST 277; ASIA/JWST 60, 357; ASIA/JWST/PWAD 235, 425; HEBR 142; HEBR/JWST, 436; RELI 103, 343, 401, 402, 403, 404. Placement credit (PL) may not be used to meet minor requirements.
