Re: Request for changes to the minor in Korean

Two courses are being added to the minor:

- KOR 408, Changes and Continuities in Korean History \*
- KOR 490, Topics in Korean Language and Literature \*

One course is being deleted because it is being deactivated: JAPN 376, Colonial East Asia/Postcolonial Japan.

We are also slightly changing the minor structure so that students have the option to substitute one of the topical 4<sup>th</sup>-year language courses for the culture course.
