SUBJECT: Revision to the Dramatic Art Minor

With the increased emphasis in our discipline on creating new dramatic works that respond to the compelling needs for social justice, along with the vital discoveries being made through the devising process itself, we propose the inclusion of DRAM 288 – Theatre for Social Change in the dramaturgy concentration of the Dramatic Art Minor.

As described in the undergraduate bulletin, this course "assesses different models of theatre for social change through change theory, playwriting, and collaboration. Students will be guided through the process of creating new works." Philosophically, it belongs as a choice for dramaturgy students who wish to explore (and contribute to) theatre which has a progressive response to the "form and pressure" of our times.

This course has been taught regularly for years and it will continue to be taught at least once per year in the future. Students will be advised of this change through advising sessions during registration, town halls, through student leaders, listservs, on-line publications, as well as hard-copy brochures and postings. Current students may consider this course for their minor requirements beginning fall of 2018.
