Dear Colleagues:

This letter is to seek approval for the an intensive Chinese Language Summer Program at Yunnan University in Kunming, China. Yunnan University, founded in 1922, is the major comprehensive university in the province and one of China's key universities, included in China's "Project 211" university development plan. Kunming, the capital of Yunnan Province in Southwestern China, is a very livable city with a cool climate. As Kunming does not have the large foreign community found in the eastern cities of Beijing and Shanghai, its environment will encourage students to immerse themselves in local culture. The geographic and cultural diversity of the province make it one of the most popular destinations in all of China, and an appropriate base for gaining a greater understanding of China as a whole.

The establishment of this program is supported by the Department of Asian Studies. Its general objective is to provide students exposure to Chinese culture and society plus the equivalent of one year of study of the Chinese language at the advanced levels. The program will be of great benefit to those students wishing to pursue the concentration in Chinese Language as part of the Asian Studies major as well as to students from other departments who wish to achieve a solid foundation in Chinese language and deepen their general understanding of China. It is also our hope that the experiences and knowledge gained on this program will encourage students to continue their study of Chinese during the remainder of their undergraduate education at UNC-CH. By cooperating directly with a Chinese University and not through a third-party provider, this program also provides our students with a less expensive option than the CET Beijing Chinese Language Summer Program (approximately 40% of the total cost of the CET program).

Hosted by the College of International Students and the International Affairs Office at Yunnan University, our students will take the equivalent of one-year of Chinese language study during this 8-week program that will run from late May through mid July. The College of International Students, founded in 1986, has trained more than 15,000 international students and teachers from 30 countries. There are 30 full-time faculty in the College including 4 senior professors and 6 associate professors. Four of the faculty hold doctorate degrees and 10 have Masters Degrees. Over half of the teachers have studied or taught overseas. It is one of the select institutions in China that has a HSK (Chinese Proficiency Test) Center at all levels and receives substantial support from the national government as a center for teaching Chinese as a foreign language. Please find CVs attached for two of their instructors.

Students will be in class for 3 contact hours per day. (approximately 120 contact hours total) over the length of the program. Third-year and fourth-year language courses will be offered. UNC-CH Chinese Language faculty in the Department of Asian Studies will create the syllabi according to our standards

and will approve the selection of instructors of each class. Average language class size at the College of International Students is under 10 students. We will create classes specifically for our students, though may allow non-UNC students to join our students in class depending on the number of students per class. Students who successfully complete this program are expected to advance their language placement upon return to UNC-CH by an entire year. The language courses are worth 6 hours of credit (2 courses at 3 credits each). This program will convey UNC-CH transfer (TREQ) credit.

In addition to language coursework, optional cultural classes will be open to our students, including Chinese Kungfu, Chinese Calligraphy, Chinese Tea Art, and Chinese Music. The program will also match our students informally with local students outside of class to practice their language. Trips to 3-4 cultural sites in the Kunming area (Bamboo Temple, Western Hills, Golden Temple, Stone Forest) will be arranged.


For our students, there is a minimum GPA requirement of 3.10 and at least 2 years of prior Chinese language study at the college level or the equivalent. Students must have at least sophomore status.


At Yunnan University, students will stay on campus in the university guesthouse in double rooms with either a local or international student. The International Affairs Office will provide students with an orientation as well as offer regular and emergency support services to our students. With over 25 years experience hosting foreign students, they have developed extensive protocols, including a list of local doctors and hospitals that treat foreign patients, and are available 24/7 in cases of emergency.

Site visits have been conducted by Prof. Gang Yue of the Asian Studies Department and Dan Gold, Asia Programs Director in the Study Abroad Office. In addition, Yunnan University hosted the Carolina SE Asia Summer Program twice (for 5 days each in 2005 and 2006) and demonstrated great skill and effort in creating suitable academic programs for our students.
