RE: Revisions to PWAD major requirements and courses

DATE: October 5, 2016

I am submitting the following changes to the PWAD major for the AY 2017/18 Bulletin (this assumes that the appropriate CRAS actions have been taken by the initiating department). These changes are also indicated in the bulletin text using track changes sent separately.

1. Existing course HIST 245 "The U.S. and the Cold War" should be crosslisted (concentration Evolution of War). Request currently pending in CRAS.

Note: pending cross-list approval.

2. Existing course POLI 458 "International Conflict Management and Resolution" should be added as counting in the major, under both Culture of Peace and War and International Security and Intelligence concentrations. Request currently pending in CRAS.

Note: pending cross-list approval.

4. Three new PWAD-sponsored courses have been added to CRAS: PWAD 359 Comparative History of National Intelligence Regimes; PWAD 360 The History of Warning Intelligence; PWAD 361 The History of Deception. All should count in International Security and Intelligence concentration.

5. Existing course ASIA 357/JWST 357 "Arab-Jews: Culture, Community, and Co-existence" should now be crosslisted with PWAD 362 (357 is not available) under Culture of Peace and War concentration. Request currently pending in CRAS.

6. Existing course ASIA 331 "Cracking India: Partition and Its Legacy in South Asia" should now be crosslisted as PWAD 331 under Culture of Peace and War Intelligence and National Security concentrations. Request currently pending in CRAS.

7. Existing course ASIA 435 "The Cinemas of the Middle East and North Africa," should now be crosslisted as PWAD 435 under Culture of Peace and War concentration. Request currently pending in CRAS

8. New Course ITAL 339 "US-Italian Encounters: War, Tourism, Myth" should be crosslisted with PWAD under the Culture of Peace and War concentration (We believe Romance Studies has entered this in CRAS).

9. New Course PLCY 330 "Conflict Management: The Practice of Negotiation and Mediation" should be crosslisted with PWAD under Culture of Peace and War. (We believe Public Policy has entered this in CRAS).

10. Remove PWAD 670 from the bulletin and course listing. The instructor does not plan to offer it again in the near future.

11. At some point in the past, POLI/PWAD 457 got listed under the Culture of Peace and War concentration. The instructor informed me that it doesn't really fit there. It belongs under International Security and Intelligence.

12. Remove PWAD/SOCIO 442. It has not been taught in many many years. SOCI is also removing it.

13. The PWAD major currently requires students to have a concentration and to take four courses within that concentration (and 2 outside it). As it stands now, students are never required to formally indicate what concentration they are in, and there is no way, therefore to track how many students are in which concentration. This has two consequences. a) we cannot plan curriculum revisions that might, for example, assign a core course to each concentration without knowing the demand that might exist for that concentration, and b) we cannot report to our granting agency about the numbers of students enrolling in the "intelligence and national security" concentration.

We would, therefore, like to begin having the students declare their sub-plan (concentration) with the Academic Advising Program in Steele Building as follows:

This concentration could be changed at any time, but it would now appear on transcripts and would be a part of the process for declaring the PWAD major (now students will also need to declare the concentration). This changes nothing about the major, but merely creates a new recordkeeping step.

14. New Course ASIA 69 " Wars and Veterans: Iran, Iraq, and Afghanistan," should be crosslisted with PWAD 69 under Culture of Peace and War. (We believe ASIA has entered this in CRAS).

PWAD 396 Independent Study in Peace, War, and Defense; PWAD 680 Research Seminar in Peace, War, and Defense; PWAD 490 Selected Topics in Peace, War, and Defense; PWAD 690 Seminars in Peace, War, and Defense; and 691H Honors in Peace, War, and Defense may be applied toward the concentration requirement with the permission of the chair. Students can request that relevant courses not on this list, but offered as first-year seminars, honors seminars, or topics courses in other departments, be used to fulfill major requirements. This requires the approval of the chair.

Additional Requirements

- Through level 5 of a single modern foreign language. Alternatively, students can take one semester of POLI 281 or STOR 151 or STOR 155, or students may suggest a substitute statistics-heavy methodology course.

All General Education requirements must be met. In fulfilling General Education requirements, majors should consider the following courses as helpful preparation for the curriculum: ANTH 101; ECON 101; HIST 127, 128, 140, 158, 159; MATH 152; PHIL 160, 170; POLI 100, 150, 239; PSYC 101; SOCI 101; and STOR 151.
